q	pronounced as a k deep in the back of your throat- q	example:	qáqnaʔ (grandma)
q̣	is pronounced as a hard q- q̣	example:	q̣aʔxán (shoe)
qʷ	is pronounced q with rounded lips- qʷ	example:	qʷacqn (hat)

q̣ʷ	is pronounced as a hard q with rounded lips- q̣ʷ	example:	q̣ʷmqin (antler)
r	is rolled on your tongue- r	example:	yirncút (make itself round)
s	pronounced as in the word <u>sister</u> - s	example:	síya? (saskatoon berry)
t	as in the word <u>top</u> - t	example:	tum̃ (mother)
ṭ	pronounced as a hard t- t	example:	ṭina? (ear)
u	as in the word <u>soon</u> - u	example:	uł (and)

xʷ	pronounced as a h with rounded lips in the back of the throat- xʷ	example:	xʷuy (go)
ǰʷ	pronounced as a guttural h with rounded lips in the back of the throat- ǰʷ	example:	ǰʷus (foam)
y	as in the word <u>yellow</u> - y	example:	yus (dark / purple)
ỵ	an abruptly ended y- y	example:	čṣỵaqn (head)
ʎ	pronounced like a short a deep in the back of the throat- ʎ	example:	ʎaymt (angry)
ʎ̣	pronounced as an abruptly ended ʎ- ʎ	example:	ʎ̣ačnt (look)
ʎʷ	pronounced as a nasally "ow" back in the throat- ʎʷ	example:	kaʎ̣m (pray)
ʎ̣ʷ	is a breath stop in the back of the throat as in the word "uh-oh"- ʎ̣ʷ	example:	ʎ̣ʷaʎ̣úsa? (egg)
