



1. Open the folder “sahaptin” by double clicking.




2. Click on the program, “setup.exe”







3. The install icon should appear blinking on your task bar. Click on it, and when the user account control window opens, click on OK.



4. If a keyboard is already present, the installer will ask you to remove or repair. Select “repair” and click “finish”.







4. If the keyboard installs, you will see the completion window. Click on “close”.




5. The keyboard switch should appear on your taskbar. Click on it to choose the keyboard for your language.





2. Click on “Time & Language”




3. Click on “Region & Language”.





4. In the Region & Language pane, click below where your current language is shown.




5. Click on the button, "options" where it appears.
